Dear Colleagues,

Thank you for entering your students in our Chapter's 2019 Student Vocal Festival. You will find the schedule indicating where and when your students will be singing for the preliminary rounds on the website. The schedule also indicates where and when you will be adjudicating on Friday, 1 November and Saturday, 2 November. Please inform yourself, your students, and your collaborative pianists. The preliminary rounds all take place in the Pérez Building at the University of Ottawa. The Winners Concert will take place in Tabaret Hall on Saturday 2 November beginning at 7 pm.

Please ask your students to check in at the registration desk 10 - 15 minutes prior to the starting time of their category. As per the last few years, your students will not be asked to hand in their music to the class monitor, BUT legal copies of all the music they will be performing must be in evidence. Music purchased from a legal website with a receipt is acceptable; other copies are not. Please ask your students to consult the detailed schedule in the lobby of the Pérez Building, and take note of any cancellations. Also please make sure that your students understand that cancellations change individual times within a class and that they must be prepared to sing at any time after the start time of their class. Failure to do this may result in disqualification.

Ask your students to wait quietly for the results of their category to be posted on the board in the lobby of the Pérez Building. Adjudication sheets will be available at the registration desk, and students should pick theirs up before leaving. Have your student notify their collaborative pianist immediately if they have been advanced to the Winners Concert.
